It wasn't until after she passed that I received one. I was intimidated to ever try my hand at quilting because of how special they were regarded in my family. In 1998 I had a sweet neighbor who quilted. As I admired her craft she explained how easy it was. She encouraged me to take baby steps and she literally held my hand through my first project. Within the next year I completed my first Thimbleberries BOM and was hooked on the geometry of cutting and creating beautiful blocks. After 23 years of being mostly self taught, I attended my first ever quilt retreat last fall and Ladies of the Lakes is the first Guild I have ever been a part of. With every new project and pattern I learn something new. "So many patterns, so little time" has become my motto.
